Did you Know!?

Ticks can become active when temperatures rise above approximately 40°F (4–5°C), while fleas can survive and reproduce in temperatures above 50°F (10°C)—especially in humid environments or indoors. Because of this, it's recommended that both dogs and cats stay on flea, tick, and heartworm prevention every 30 days, year-round.
